Whereas, the history of African-American/Black History Month traces back to 1915, when the "Father of Black History Month," Dr. Carter G. Woodson, founded the Association for the Study of Negro Life and History, which is currently known as the Association for the Study of African American Life and History (ASALH). Through their diligence and commitment to African American citizens, Dr. Woodson and the ASALH introduced the first "Negro History Week" in February 1926; and

Whereas, Delaware County Council is proud to have numerous members of the community, schools, businesses, organizations, and County employees who work to educate, celebrate, and expand Black history and culture through education and the arts; and
