



#### **GRANT ROUND 4 HIGHLIGHTS**

- Match is not required, but submissions including a match (either cash or in-kind services) receive a scoring bonus
- Projects in areas identified by regional or state agencies as "potentially disadvantaged" or as "Environmental Justice Areas" receive a scoring bonus
- CONSERVE projects for conservation easements require significant public benefit but do not <u>require</u> public access
- ➤ ENHANCE projects have a 15% allowance of the total project cost for planning and design expenses
- CONNECT projects for trail design & engineering have a \$250,000 cap, unless they are part of the Primary Trail Network.
- Applications include standard grant agreements that awardees must sign before the distribution of award money
- Electronic signatures are now accepted for application submissions and payment requests.

#### What Types Of Projects & Grant Amounts Are Funded?

#### **Conserve Projects**

Up to \$500,000 to protect undeveloped land in perpetuity.

<u>Eligible projects</u>: fee simple acquisition, conservation or trail easements on private land, and other similar conservation methods.

#### **Enhance Projects**

Up to \$250,000 for capital improvements to park and/or recreational facilities.

<u>Eligible projects</u>: improvements to existing park facilities and regreening efforts (e.g., street trees, green stormwater infrastructure, etc.)

#### **Connect Projects**


Up to \$500,000 for developing multi-use trails included on the County's Primary Trail Network (PTN).

Up to \$250,000 for other, single- or multi-use local trails outside of the PTN.

<u>Eligible projects:</u> final design and construction documents for trails within the PTN or local trails.

#### **Planning & Design Projects**

Up to \$100,000 for planning efforts fueling intentional, strategic parks, recreation and open space projects. Eligible projects: full-scope, comprehensive parks, recreation, and open space plans, park master plans, trail network plans, feasibility studies, needs assessments, conceptual design plans for parks and/or recreational facilities, preliminary engineering, permitting, title searches, and appraisals.



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## Delaware County Mini-Parks, Recreation, Open Space Plan (Mini-PROS Plans)

- ✓ Communities under 8,000 in population, or 1.5 sq. miles in area.
- ✓ PA DCNR compatible
- ✓ Up to \$50,000 per project Noncompetitive!
- ✓ Up to \$100,000, if multi-municipal
- ✓ Purpose: get ALL municipalities planning to be eligible for more grant opportunities.

### Mini PROS Plan Grants: Context

## Delaware County Mini-Parks, Recreation, Open Space Plan (Mini-PROS Plans)

- ✓ Ensure grant funds support professionally planned projects supporting community goals
- ✓ Aids in building capacity by rewarding partnerships
- ✓ Communities above those thresholds with large parks and recreation needs, and community challenges or opportunities can apply for a larger grant.


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















# What Do I Need to Do to Win a Delco Green Ways Grant Award?



## What Do I Need to Do to Win a Delco Green Ways Grant Award?

#### **Answer:**

Refer to and highlight how your project meets the *Evaluation Criteria* (in the User's Guide), which link to County funding priorities.







#### **Evaluation Description**

#### **Criteria = Guideposts**

Identify & describe how does your project further the County goals to connect, conserve and enhance local communities?

#### Three types of evaluation criteria:

- those applicable to all projects,
- > those applicable to *specific* projects, and
- > narrative questions to describe how the project furthers County goals.

Identify & discuss the individual elements that best fit your project.

No expectations that a project will meet all the criteria, so do no need to comment on "non-applicable" criteria.

#### **General Evaluation Criteria**

In addition to project-specific evaluation criteria listed on the following pages, the list below details the general evaluation criteria that will be applied to projects in all four (4) grant types:

Socio-Economic Distress — Delaware County's Council is committed to ensuring no reside or community is left behind. To further this commitment, County staff will identify and consider the following items on each application (Relative to:		
<ul> <li>The Delaware Valley Regional Planning Commission's <u>Indicator of Potential</u> <u>Disadvantage</u> (IPD) Score, and</li> <li>The Pennsylvania Department of Environmental Protection's <u>Environmental Justice Areas</u>.</li> </ul>

Working with Neighbors or Other Partners

#### Project Type: Conserve


Conserve projects serve to protect undeveloped land in perpetuity. Eligible projects include fee simple land acquisition; conservation or public trail easements on private land; and other similar conservation methods. The Green Ways Grant Program calls for CONSERVE projects to provide public benefits; for example, permanently protecting sensitive natural environments or preserving viewsheds along public rights of ways or riversare acceptable. Delaware County will decide, in its sole discretion and on a case-by-case basis, when Conserve projects without full public access are eligible for a Green Ways Grant award.


#### 8. Frequently Asked Questions

How many grants applications may a municipality or non-profit organization subn


Municipalities and Non-Profit Organizations in partnership with a municipality are apply for two projects. If the municipality or non-profit is applying for two grants, or two must be a project from the PLANNING & DESIGN category. The other grant can be from one of the three other grant types: CONSERVE, CONNECT, or ENF

- Does sponsoring a non-profit count against a municipality's grant application cap
  - No, sponsoring non-profits does not count against the cap. The sponsoring mustill eligible for two grants; one in the planning category and one from any of the Connect, Enhance categories.
- If a municipality partners with a neighboring municipality for project, can it still ap grants on its own?

Yes. Multi-municipal projects are encouraged by this program. To remove progra for municipal partnering, any municipality partnering with another municipality for still eligible to apply for two additional municipal projects (one in the planning cat one from any of the Conserve, Connect, Enhance categories).
