Due to COVID-19 the public meeting for the Delaware County Jail Oversight Board was held via hybrid and aired live on Tuesday, April 12, 2022 at 4:30 pm in the Delaware County Council Meeting Room, Government Center Building, Media, PA. The public was permitted to submit questions or comments before and after the meeting at JOB@co.delaware.pa.us.

Present: Kevin Madden, Chair; Joanne Phillips, Vice Chair; Deborah Love, Citizen Appointment; Warden Laura Williams; Deputy Warden Lisa Mastroddi; Deputy Warden of Programs and Support, Dele Faly; Re-Entry Coordinator and Programs Administrator, Kelly Shaw; Education Administrator and Workplace Development, Joan Skurski; Substance Use Coordinator, Pat O'Connor; PREP Coordinator, Hillary Jones; Chaplain Cokelia Dunn; Human Resources Manager, Iris Wiley; Office Manager, Nicole Miller; and Carlton Johnson, Esq. of Archer & Greiner.

The following JOB members attended via zoom: Executive Director, Howard Lazarus; Honorable John J. Whelan; Honorable Mary Alice Brennan; Sheriff Jerry Sanders; Brian Corson, Citizen Appointment; Jonathan King, Citizen Appointment. Also, on the call was Majid Alsayegh of Alta Management.

Prior to the meeting, Mr. Madden announced that an executive session was held on Monday, April 11th to discuss personnel and public safety manners.

Public Comment on Agenda Items: There was no public comment on Agenda Items.

Approval of the March Meeting Minutes: Motion made by Judge Whelan to approve the minutes from the March JOB meeting, seconded by Mr. Lazarus. Judge Brennan mentioned that she was not present at the last meeting, however she did approve the meeting minutes. Motion carried unanimously.

Approval of the March Reports: Motion made by Controller Phillips to approve the reports for March 2022, seconded by Judge Whelan. Motion carried unanimously.

Warden Williams deviated from the agenda and mentioned "Ramadan Mubarak" George W. Hill Correctional Facility is representative of a diverse population of employees and incarcerated persons. Ramadan is the holiest month of the year in Islamic culture. This is a time for spiritual reflection and growth, prayer and fasting. Ramadan began at sundown on April 1st and ends the evening of May 1, 2022.

Staffing Penalty approval for March 2022: Warden Williams presented the March and April Staffing Penalties. Mr. Corson made a motion to approve the staffing penalties, seconded by Ms. Phillips. Motion carried unanimously.

Mr. Madden asked if there were any subcommittee reports for March: Controller Phillips commented that the Re-Entry subcommittee had been stepped aside during the transition. Mr. Corson would like to meet with Warden Williams to discuss the MAT subcommittee. Mr. King thanked Ms., Williams for her communication during the transition.

Coronavirus Update: During March, there were 237 incarcerated individuals tested for COVID-19 utilizing PCR tests. There was 1 positive infection. There were no staff members out on quarantine. Currently there are zero infections among the incarcerated population. Previously, the Medical Department had utilized Correctek (Electronic Health Records System) During the transition, they will be utilizing ERMA. By using the new system, they will establish a tracking system regarding vaccination percentage and commits vaccinated. There were no vaccination clinics during the month of March. There will be vaccination clinics established in the future.

Warden Williams mentioned that George W. Hill has transitioned to full county operations and management on April 6th as of 12:01 am. Ms. Williams felt incredibly fortunate to have a strong leadership team that demonstrates and embodies integrity, ethics, and values. Ms. Williams recognized Deputy Warden Lisa Mastroddi; Deputy Warden Dele Faly; Major Albert Pleasant; Major Richard Leach; Shift Commanders and Lieutenants: Lieutenant Davis; Lieutenant Lubrano; Lieutenant Moody; Lieutenant Moore and Lieutenant Platt. Ms. Williams extended gratitude to the men and women who have worked through adversity and extraordinary challenges to make the transition possible.

Warden Williams formally introduced the vision statement of George W. Hill Correctional Facility: To increase public safety in Delaware County by providing care, custody, and control of incarcerated persons. We promote correctional practices and exceed standards to maximize the safety of the community, employees and those entrusted in our care. We provide education and training

opportunities for employees to strengthen their expertise in correctional practices and specialized areas to enhance the institution and provision of services. We will continue to explore critical issues, best and promising practices and matters of public policy to collaborate with the Criminal Justice System and Delaware County stakeholders. We will serve as a conduit for other health services and criminal justice partners to safely reduce the jail population and overall recidivism rate. We will provide a continuum of programs, education, services, and workforce opportunities to meet the needs of those entrusted to our care. The goal is to reduce criminal genic behaviors, increase law abiding behavior, increase self-actualization and improvement behaviors and gain or restore overall health. Through the fulfillment of this vision, George W. Hill Correctional Facility will be a leader in the field of Corrections.

Values: Integrity, courage, ethics, honor, respect, service, duty, professionalism, innovation, transparency, accountability, sustainability, equity, and correctional excellence.

Warden Williams mentioned that the first week of May is Correctional Employees week and the following week will be Nurses Week.

Mr. Madden noted that April 6th was a starting line, not a finish line. Mr. Madden was impressed with the transparency and the transition overall. However, there is still a lot of heavy lifting to do.

Public Comment: Majid Alsayegh congratulated the JOB and thanked the board for their support.

There was no further business, nor public comment. Motion made by Ms. Love to adjourn the meeting, seconded by Mr. Corson.

Since the Delaware County Government took over, this is a significant increase from 9 dosages in March 2022. We incorporated the recommendation for review from the Jail Oversight Board and routine process improvement reviews and have identified resolutions to increase the volume of Narcan being provided at time of release. Thank you to the Security Intake and Discharge team personnel Major Albert Pleasant, Lieutenant Tyrance Moore, Lieutenant Kerry Platt and Sergeant Darold Williams.

Prison Re-entry Education Program (PREP)

- PREP I is an eight-week evidenced based program that focuses on educating inmates on addictions and behaviors
- PREP II is geared toward repeat offenders who successfully completed PREP I. It is a 12-week program with a primary focus of the 12 Steps of AA/NA. Additionally Thinking for a Change (T4C) will be incorporated where applicable. Prior to enrollment successful completion of PREP I is required.
