### **Official Notice of Election for Military and Overseas Voters County of DELAWARE General Election November 5, 2024**

This is an official notice of the General Election to be conducted on November 5, 2024, in Delaware County. You may register to vote and request an official absentee ballot by using the Federal Post Card Application (FPCA), available at [www.vote.pa.gov](http://www.vote.pa.gov) or [www.fvap.gov](http://www.fvap.gov). You may apply for an absentee ballot by submitting your FPCA by fax to (610) 892-0641 or by email to [uocava@co.delaware.pa.us](mailto:uocava@co.delaware.pa.us)

You may request an absentee ballot from this office at any time prior to a Primary or Election. However, if time does not permit you to receive and return an official absentee ballot, you are also entitled to vote using the Federal Write-in Absentee Ballot (FWAB). Military electors may also use the FWAB to register to vote and vote simultaneously.

You may use the FWAB to vote for a candidate for President of the United States, U.S. Senator and U.S. Representative (Representative in Congress) as well as candidates for all state and local offices, and ballot initiatives.

To vote, fill out and send in the **Voter Information Page** (page 2) and **Official Backup Ballot** (page 3) of the FWAB.

- To vote for President of the United States, U.S. Senate (U.S. Senator) and U.S Representative (Representative in Congress) – write in the name of the candidate in the space provided on the FWAB.
- To vote for state and local offices or for ballot initiatives – write the names of candidates or the ballot initiative in the appropriate section of the FWAB.
  - Under the **Office/Ballot Initiative** heading, enter the office the candidate is running for or the title of the Ballot Initiative (referendum).
  - Under the **Candidate Name, Party Affiliation or Initiative Vote** heading, list the name of the candidate you wish to vote for, or if you are voting on a Referendum question write “yes” or “no.”

District shall consist of Part of DELAWARE COUNTY consisting of the CITY of Chester and the TOWNSHIPS of Aston, Bethel, Chadds Ford, Chester, Concord, Edgmont, Lower Chichester, Middletown, Nether Providence, Thornbury and Upper Chichester and the BOROUGHs of Brookhaven, Chester Heights, Eddystone, Marcus Hook, Parkside, Rose Valley, Trainer, and Upland.

**SENATOR IN THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY – 17<sup>th</sup> Senatorial District** (Vote for One)  
District shall consist of Part of DELAWARE COUNTY consisting of the of the TOWNSHIPS of Haverford and Radnor.

**REPRESENTATIVE IN THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY – 159<sup>th</sup> Legislative District** (Vote for One)  
District shall consist of Part of DELAWARE County consisting of the CITY of Chester and the TOWNSHIPS of Lower Chichester and Upper Chichester and the BOROUGHs of Eddystone, Marcus Hook, Parkside, and Trainer.

**REPRESENTATIVE IN THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY – 160<sup>th</sup> Legislative District** (Vote for One)  
District shall consist of Part of DELAWARE COUNTY consisting of the TOWNSHIPS of Bethel, Chadds Ford, Concord and Thornbury and the BOROUGH of Chester Heights.

**REPRESENTATIVE IN THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY – 161<sup>st</sup> Legislative District** (Vote for One)  
District shall consist of Part of DELAWARE COUNTY consisting of the TOWNSHIPS of Aston, Chester, Middletown (PART, District 1 and District 2 [PART Precincts 1 and 2]), Nether Providence, Ridley (PART, Wards 1 [PART, Precinct 1 and 3], 2, 5 [PART, Precinct 1] and 7) and the BOROUGHs of Brookhaven, Rose Valley and Upland.

**REPRESENTATIVE IN THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY – 162<sup>nd</sup> Legislative District** (Vote for One)  
District shall consist of Part of DELAWARE COUNTY consisting of the TOWNSHIPS of Darby (PART, Wards 1 and 2) and Ridley (PART, Wards 1 [PART, Precinct 2], 3, 4, 5 [PART Precinct 2], 6, 8 and 9) and the BOROUGHs of Folcroft, Glenolden, Norwood, Prospect Park, Ridley Park, Rutledge and Sharon Hill.

**REPRESENTATIVE IN THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY – 163<sup>rd</sup> Legislative District** (Vote for One)

District shall consist of Part of DELAWARE County consisting of the TOWNSHIPS of Darby (PART, Wards 3, 4 and 5) and Upper Darby (PART, Districts 1, 2, 3 [PART Precincts 1, 2, 3, 4, 5, 8, 9, 10 and 11] and 5 [PART, Precincts 4, 6, 8 and 9]) and the BOROUGHs of Aldan, Clifton Heights and Collingdale.

**REPRESENTATIVE IN THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY – 164<sup>th</sup> Legislative District** (Vote for One)

District shall consist of Part of DELAWARE County consisting of the TOWNSHIP of Upper Darby (PART, District 3 [PART, Precincts 6 and 7], 4, 5 [PART, Precincts 1, 2, 3, 5, 7 and 10] 6 and 7) and the BOROUGHs of East Lansdowne, Lansdowne and Millbourne

**REPRESENTATIVE IN THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY – 165<sup>th</sup> Legislative District** (Vote for One)

District shall consist of Part of DELAWARE County consisting of the TOWNSHIPS of Marple (PART, Wards 4 [PART, Division 2], 5, 6 and 7), Springfield and Upper Providence and the BOROUGHs of Media, Morton, and Swarthmore.

**REPRESENTATIVE IN THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY – 166<sup>th</sup> Legislative District** (Vote for One)

EXPLANATORY STATEMENT

The purpose of the foregoing questions to determine whether licenses for the sale of alcoholic beverages should be available to applicants in Upland Borough. Should a majority of those voting on the question vote in favor thereof, then anyone wishing to sell alcoholic beverages in Upland Borough would be eligible to apply for a liquor license from the Pennsylvania Liquor Control Board. Should a majority of those voting on the question vote in opposition thereof, then licenses for the sale of liquor will not be granted to applicants in Upland Borough.
