<u>Attention Delaware County High School students</u>: Are you interested in a real-life experience in how elections work? The Delaware County Bureau of Elections has an opportunity for qualified individuals to serve in paid positions in the polls on Election Day. <u>New</u>: Students may choose to receive community service hours instead of monetary compensation.

Requirements:

Under the Pennsylvania Election Code [25 P.S. § 2672 (b)], the County board may appoint US citizens ages 17-18, even if they are not yet registered voters, to serve as the clerk or machine inspector as follows:

- (1) The County may appoint a maximum of two students in the same precinct, and
- (2) The Judge of Elections shall supervision of the student, and,
- (3) The county board compensates the student, and,
- (4) The county board shall comply with all applicable Federal and State laws, and,
- (5) On Election Day, the student must be:
 - i. At least seventeen (17) years of age, and,
 - ii. A United States citizen and a resident of the county, and,
 - iii. Enrolled in a high-school/secondary educational institution and an honor-roll student, as determined by the educational institution, and
 - iv. Have submitted proof of consent of a school principal/director AND a parent or guardian.
 - v. By law, students may **not** serve as the Judge of Election, Majority or Minority Inspector.

Expectations:

• Students are required to have the completed permission forms signed and submitted to Voter Services prior to the election.

0 <u>Please return by 5/16/25 for the May 20th Municipal Primary Election.</u>

- Under state labor laws, students who are age 17 may work only a half day, while students who are age 18 may work a full day.
- Students are expected to work the entire half- or full-day shift.
- Students are encouraged to attend a training class prior to Election Day. To be paid for training, students must pass a test and serve successfully on Election Day.
- If spaces are available, we will work to assign students to work in or close to their home precincts.
- Students working the polls may choose to be compensated either by check (sent about 3 weeks after the election) **OR** by community service hours.

How to apply?

Simply fill out the form on the opposite side and return it to Delaware County Bureau of Elections prior to the next election. Both halves of the consent form need to be completed before turning in to the Bureau of Elections. A welcome packet will be sent with the training schedule and precinct information.
